IWIRC Carolinas 2018 Network Annual Report Addendum

1. A list of the Network's Board of Directors for the 2019-2020 two-year term is attached hereto. We are losing our Treasurer from the last few years and are actively seeking a replacement.
2. We held five telephone board meetings in 2018.
3. We were unable to have our annual board meeting in December, 2018, so we held it on February 22, 2019 to be retroactive to December, 2018. At this meeting, we elected new officers and directors as listed on the attached schedule.
4. A list of events is attached.
5. Besides IWIRC National, we had no other sponsors for any of our events in 2018.
6. We had two reports for the IWIRC eNewsletter in 2018.
7. We had 23 members in 2018, up from 14 in 2017.
8. Our main goals in 2018 were geography, membership, and communications.
9. Being a geographically diverse network has made it hard for us to reach a lot of potential members and increase our membership. We decided to have more local events to address this goal. Rebecca Redwine and Jill Walters held a networking happy hour in Raleigh that resulted in several new members and Jane Downey arranged an Eco-tour boat cruise at the South Carolina Bankruptcy Institute that resulted in several new members. We have lost a longtime Board member in the Charlotte area and are in the process of trying to recruit more members in Charlotte and in the western part of North Carolina.

Being geographically diverse also makes it difficult to meet and communicate with one another in person. Jennifer Lyday as Communications chair has worked to increase our communications to our members and to potential members. One way we have done this is to create an active Facebook page to share information on a more informal basis.
10. IWIRC has been incredibly helpful this past year in providing advice and guidance and in helping us finance our recruiting events, especially the South Carolina Eco-tour Boat Cruise, and in providing advice and guidance on ways to make the events more attractive to potential members.
11. The 2018 Financial Statement is attached.
12. We are filing the 2018 yearly tax form commensurate with this Annual Report.
13. We did not update the Network's Rules of Operation in 2018.

14. While we continue to face the challenge of finding events that appeal to and convenient for members and potential members from a wide geographic area and with very different professional backgrounds, we have gained a lot of new members this past year who are very enthusiastic about IWIRC through local recruiting events. We plan to increase these in 2019 with knowledge that we need to seek more members in Charlotte and the western part of North Carolina. We have a new Board Chair and Chair-elect who are very active and have already lined up a lot of new events for 2019 and who are already attracting even more new members. We are very excited for 2019-2020.
